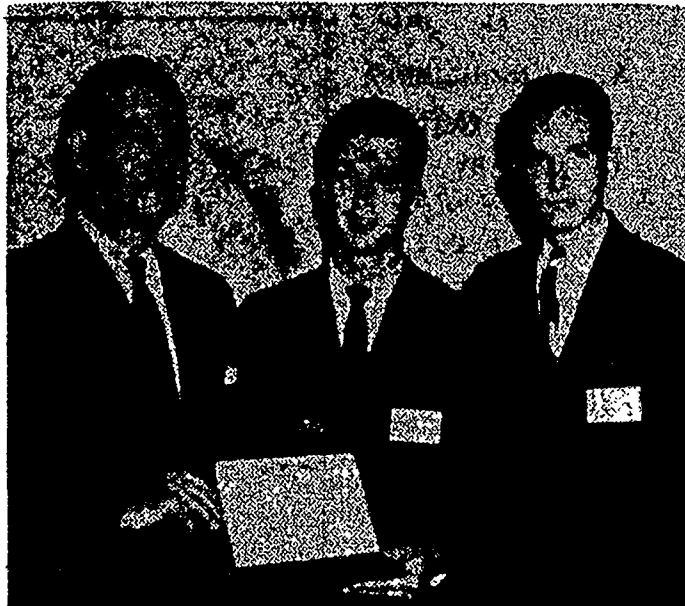

## PEANUT BUTTER CRUNCHIES

About 34 cookies

2 cups sifted enriched self-rising flour  
1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar  
1/4 teaspoon baking soda  
3/4 cup crunchy peanut butter  
1/2 cup sugar  
1/2 cup butter or margarine, softened  
1/2 cup hot water

Onto square of wax paper sift together flour and baking soda. In medium-sized mixing bowl combine peanut butter, sugars, butter or margarine and water until well blended and creamy. Stir flour into peanut butter mixture, blending well. Shape into two rolls, 2-inches in diameter. Wrap in wax paper; chill until firm. Set out ungreased baking sheets. Preheat oven to 400°. Unwrap cookie rolls and cut into 1/4-inch slices; place on baking sheet. Bake 8 to 10 minutes, or until lightly browned.

\*If you don't sift and in the absence of other directions, spoon flour directly from container into a one-cup dry measure, level off, then remove two level tablespoons, according to USDA recommendations.
