### How You Can Have \$\$\$ for College

FORT MONROE, Va.—The average cost of four years of college these days is estimated at \$11,280—but for about 1,000 high school seniors it will be a fraction of that sum.

They will be the winners of four-year, full tuition Army ROTC scholarships for which applications now are being accepted. According to Army ROTC headquarters here, high school seniors may apply for the grants between now and December 31.

The scholarships pay the full cost of tuition, textbooks, lab fees, and other purely educational expenses. Students who win them also are paid a monthly tax-free allowance of \$100 for up to 10 months each school year—a sum which can add up to several thousand dol-

lars during the four-year period.

Winners also receive the cost of travel for the first trip from their homes to their schools—any one of 293 colleges and universities offering the Army ROTC program across the country.

To apply, high school seniors must be at least 17 years old by October 1, 1973, and be under 25 on June 30 of the year in which they will graduate from college. On completion of college, the cadet is commissioned a 2nd Lt. and serves four years as an Army officer.

Standard Telephone Company, Cornelia, Georgia, has filed an application with the Georgia Public Service Commission in which authority is requested to borrow from the Rural Telephone Bank the principal amount of \$3,517,500, bearing interest at the rate of 5.5 per cent from the date of the Mortgage Note or Notes such as will be executed with respect to the loan.

According to the application, proceeds derived from this loan will be used as follows:

- complete service to unserved prior loan subscribers.
- extend service to 2,578 new subscribers.
- construct 27 related prior miles of line and 83 miles of new purpose line.
- provide for miscellaneous toll and EAS trunk additions to existing trunk groups.
- provide for miscellaneous service re-grading, and provide for related system improvements including construction of a CDO building addition on existing land which will be required for the new electronic type switchboard in Cornelia and miscellaneous other central office equipment additions, and provide for backbone plant on major cable routes where additions are required to meet the 1974 requirements.
- cover engineering fees.
- purchase class B stock of the Rural Telephone Bank in the amount of \$167,500.

This matter has been assigned for public hearing before the Commission beginning at 10:00 a. m. on Wednesday, Oct. 25, 1972, in the Commission's Hearing Room, 177 State Office Building, 244 Washington Street, S. W., Atlanta, Georgia, at which time anyone interested in this matter will be given an opportunity of expressing his views.
